### WHTW Timeline and information

We have been asked about the timeline of the wattle seeds going to and from space.

The seeds were sent to JAXA on June 15, 2020.

The wattle seeds arrived at JAXA on June 22, 2020.

Then, the seeds were shipped from JAXA to USA on October 6, 2020.

They were launched on SpaceX 21 and docked on the ISS on December 7, 2020.

The splashed down on Earth from the ISS on SpaceX 22 July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

The space flight wattle seeds arrived at JAXA on July 30, 2021.

The seeds then arrived in Australia on August 18, 2021.

# Mission Control: What'll Happen to The Wattle??!

Students from Wyvern House Preparatory School have begun a project we have called 'Mission Control: What'll Happen to The Wattle??!'. Students are growing a control experiment and researching the germination and growth of our Acacia Pycnantha (Golden Wattle) seeds. Their research will assist us in comparing our growth rates and germination rates.

Lindsay Bosch, their STEM teacher, approached One Giant Leap Australia Foundation seeing if we had any spare kits. After discussions, we came up with a project and very quickly the students couldn't wait to start! "The boys are loving 'being proper scientists' in Year 4!"

So – if you have an idea for an extension project about the wattle or sweet basil seeds – we would like to talk about it to you. You never know unless you ask!
